Rotary Youth Driver Awareness, which District 9690 has taken on as an initiative to assist in the education of young people about Road Safety. Primarily targeted at year 11 students learning to drive. Program targets “awareness” and ‘attitude change” and seeks to encourage young people who are on the verge of driving to learn to take a more responsible attitude to motoring. Comprising 6 sessions in one day event at a non school site, it co-ordinates the efforts of local road safety experts, driving instructors, Police and recovering victims of road accidents, drug and alcohol educators and financial services personnel in such a way that the students are made aware of the privilege & responsibilities of owning and driving a car. Volunteers from within the various Clubs of the district are being asked to assist with the administration on the day and with the costs of the ‘hardship’ cases (enabling all student to be able to attend) as students contribute to the cost individually. Paul showed the club a DVD of some of the sessions. This will also be shown at the Conference.
