

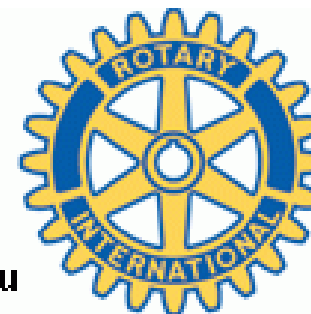
The Laws Of Golf
