Resolutions for Consideration at District Session (synopsis)

- Adopt the audited financial & balance sheet as presented for the Rotary Year 2005/2006.
- All financial accounts administered by the various District Committees and or sub-committees (except the Youth Exchange account) be closed on 30th June 2007 and the balance of funds in all such accounts be forwarded to the District Treasurer to be banked in the District's Administration Fund Account.
- The draft Rules (Version 1- 9th March 2007) and any subsequent amendments advised by RI for the incorporation of district 9690, in accordance with the code of Policies of Rotary International Item 17.020 be adopted.
- The updated District Administration and Finance Committee-Policy and Procedures Draft 9-9th March 2007 that will replace current Draft 8-4th March 2005, be adopted.
- District 9690 withdraws from the Australian Rotarians corporate Alliance Program (ARCAP) and the district Governor be requested to advise the general secretary of R.I. in accordance with R.I. Policy. It is further resolved that District resolution 13.2 be hereby rescinded.
- No member of the District Group Study Exchange Committee, including any member who subsequently resigns from such committee, shall be eligible to nominate for the position of Group Study Exchange Team Leader in the year in which such Committee operates.

The Trust invests its funds in secure Trustee-Approved investments. Each year funds will be distributed to successful applicants as a one-year financial award. In some instances the Trust may continue its support provided that significant benefit can be demonstrated from the assistance.
