

- I got a Bankstown firm to ferry the plane from the US to Australia. They wanted to ferry 2 planes of the same speed, but the other plane wasn't ready and delayed mine.

- The firm eventually got the plane to Hilo, then 11 days later made arrangements to carry on to Australia 4 days after that. A further 4 days after that date, we left Hilo and flew to Christmas Island (the largest coral atoll in the world). One end of the island was used for nuclear bomb tests, and is now radioactive and fenced off.
- We then flew to Pango Pango, then on to Noumea, and then to the Gold Coast, and straight on to Bankstown Airport. Each leg of the trip from Hilo took a day, but we crossed and re-crossed the International Date Line, so the day and date changed forwards and backwards.
