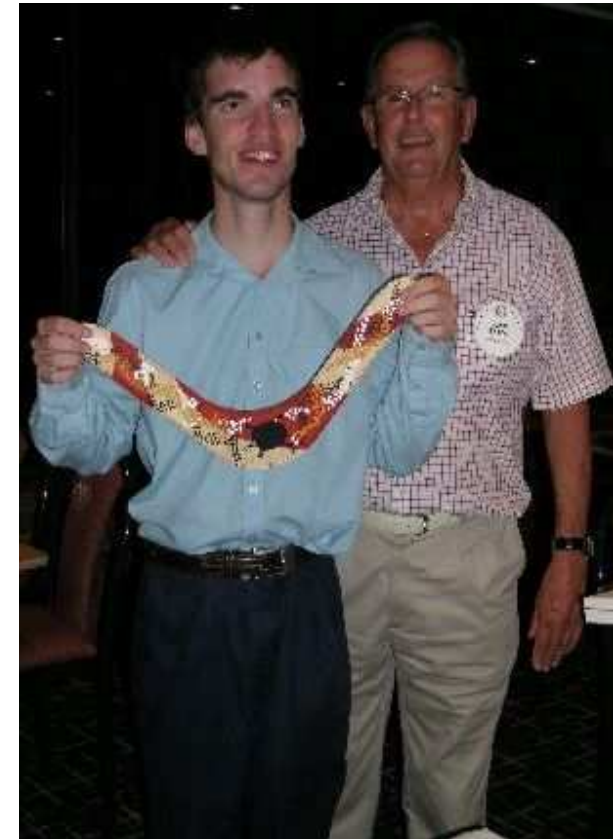
Keri introduced her son Brenton Sweet.
